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What is the Community Health Worker (CHW) Program?

It is a program working with your provider to offer support at home.

We can help with things like:


- Taking medications as prescribed
- Affording medications
- Monitoring CHF symptoms and knowing when to call for help
- Becoming and staying physically active
- Setting up medical appointments
- Finding transportation to appointments
- Understanding what is said at doctor appointments and helping you apply what you have learned
- Finding housing or help with affording rent and utilities
- And much more!



How it works:

Your Community Health Worker (CHW) will visit your home before starting the six-month program. During the first three months, the CHW will meet with you every two weeks to help support your social and medical needs. After that, they will visit once a month. Visits can change with your needs.

Social needs (housing, food, and transportation) are important to your health. Medical needs (help with making medical changes, filling out health insurance applications, and getting help paying for medications) can make staying healthy easier. With your permission, we will connect you with available resources to meet those needs.
